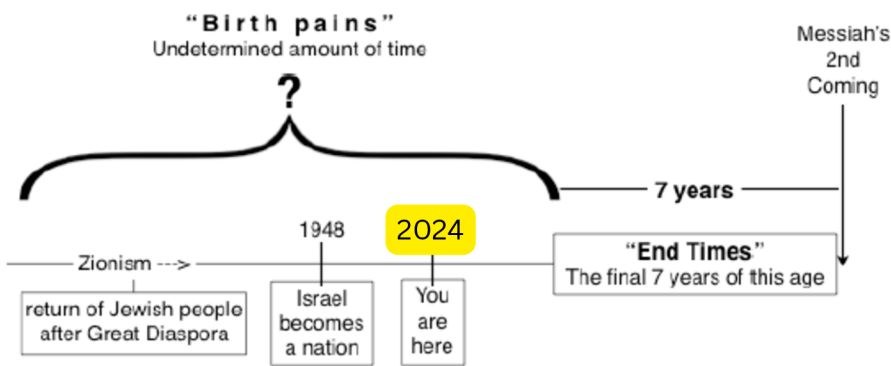


Debunking the “pre-trib rapture”
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II. Overview illustration of the timeframe of today
and the end times

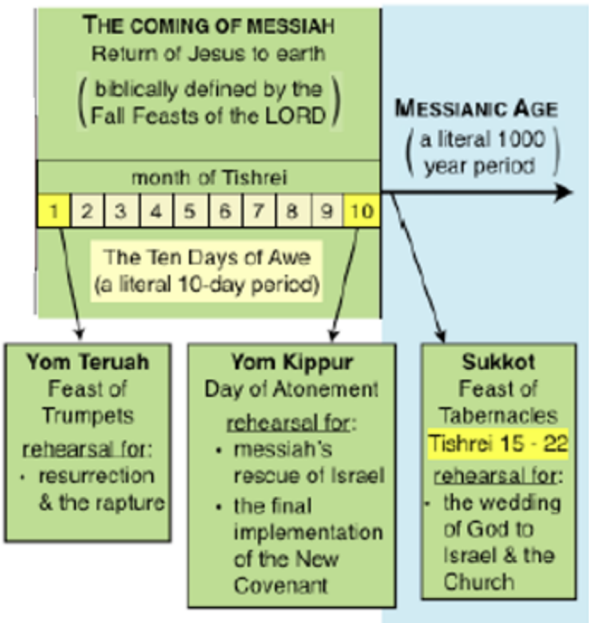
This Overview shows the **three**, main, *biblically-defined* time frames of the end times and Jesus’ return



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Here we *zoom in* on the event of **Messiah’s 2nd Coming**. This event occurs in a matter of 10 literal days according to the prophetic rehearsals embedded in the fall biblical holidays.

- **Yom Teruah** is the rehearsal for the resurrection and the rapture.
- **Yom Kippur** is the rehearsal for Messiah’s rescue of Israel from the Antichrist and his armies and casting Satan into the abyss.
- The ten days in which these holidays begin and end are the **Ten Days of Awe**, the rehearsal for Messiah’s 10-day war march from Edom to Jerusalem.



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Here we *zoom in further* to understand the multiple “prophetic rehearsal elements” contained in each of the fall holidays of **Yom Teruah** and **Yom Kippur**.

Matching each of these prophetic rehearsal elements to Scripture about the end times, the day of the Lord, Jesus’ return, the rapture, etc., shows the **Messiah’s 2nd coming** will be in accordance with the fall holidays - to the literal day and hour - as they occur on the Jewish calendar.

And we can establish an accurate **Sequence of End Times Events** and determine the rapture occurs at the end of end times events.

Teshuvah (40 days)

Elul
30 days

Elul is the 6th month on the Jewish calendar. This month is a time of deep introspection, reflection and repentance before the judgment events of the Ten Days of Awe.

Elul is also the first 30 days of Teshuvah.

2. "WHOLLY GOOD"																			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At Yom Teruah, these people are at once inscribed in the Book of Life and life is decreed for them 																			
3. "AVERAGE CLASS" (intermediates)																			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At Yom Teruah, these people are held in the balance until the final judgment on Yom Kippur They have only 9 days left to repent before Neilah, when the books are closed on Yom Kippur
